




Task 1. To become a sailor was Leo's cherished dream. Now he has the chance to attend the nautical school to get knowledge about this profession and pass the exams.




Alphabet flags







BERMUDA TRIANGLE

Bermuda Triangle is the region of the western Atlantic Ocean that has become **(41) associated** in the popular imagination with mysterious maritime disasters. Also known as **(42)** ______ Triangle, **(43)** _____ area covers about 1,140,000 sq km between the island of Bermuda, the coast of southern Florida and Puerto Rico.
