




BERMUDA TRIANGLE

Bermuda Triangle is the region of the western Atlantic Ocean that has become **(41) associated** in the popular imagination with mysterious maritime disasters. Also known as **(42)** _____ Triangle, **(43)** _____ area covers about 1,140,000 sq km between the island of Bermuda, the coast of southern Florida and Puerto Rico.

The **(44) sinister** reputation of the Bermuda Triangle may be **(45) traceable** to reports made in the late 15th century by navigator Christopher Columbus concerning the Sargasso Sea, in which **(46)** _____ masses of gulfweed were regarded as uncanny and **(47) dangerous** by early sailors; others date the **(48) notoriety** of the area to the mid-19th century, when a number of reports **(49)** _____ of unexplained disappearances and **(50)** _____ abandoned ships.
